By God's grace and hard work, Cafe 65 continues to be a hot spot where friendships are made and strengthened, and where visitors are invited to be Disciples of Christ and members of his Body here at the Ascension. Food Bank Outreach

The Community Share Food Bank, had its beginning with a Reach Grant from the Diocese and has been a friend to all the new Syrian refugees that have relocated to the Don Mills area. Some 791 Syrian and Armenian refugees have settled in our neighbourhood. Most are overjoyed with the welcome and the opportunities that Canada has given them. It is now over a year since they arrived and their financial support has run out. They have come with very few possessions and they all have stories of the war back home and how it affected their lives. We can't imagine some of the difficulties that these new Canadians have gone through just to get to Canada but we can be instruments of God's peace, and be *Lights* helping these refugees find their way in our city by coming out on Food Bank Outreach Saturdays, (usually held the 2nd Saturday of the month), and be the caring presence of Christ's love.

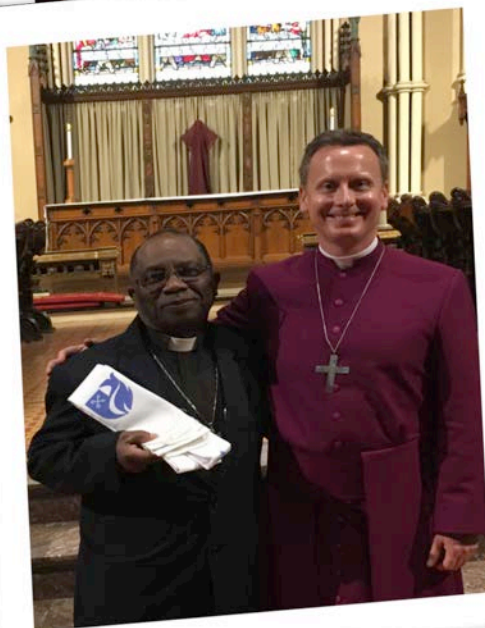
Una Cambridge

Joyful Giving: An Opportunity

Joyful giving. These are two words that we don't normally put together. Joy we tend to associate with receiving. Beautiful weather, time with friends and family, and receiving good news. On the other hand, giving can sometimes evoke fear and anxiety.

The Apostle Paul encourages the churches in Corinth to think differently about giving: "The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:6-7).

We recognize that everything we have comes to us from God, and we know that God gives not out of obligation but out of love. Our blessings are his joy. Giving through stewardship can be full of joy when we understand it is an opportunity to work with God and allow him to work through us. God has great plans for our church and us, and he wants us to partner with him as Christ's living body. In fact, it's not so much that God wants us to be part of his plan, but that we ARE the plan. God in Jesus Christ gives everything and intends for those who follow his way to give generously to others as he showed us to do.

This Easter Season, pray and ask God, "How can I help?" We come together as a group of committed Christians gathered at the Ascension ready to minister to the needs of our diverse community and make disciples of Christ, focusing on three areas of giving as ways to fulfill our congregation's mission as a Light in the City through time, talent and treasure

Sharing our time, talent and treasure create the foundation for how vital and how impactful our church will be in Don Mills.

Many of you will and have already made a generous donation to our Boiler #2 Campaign, and I thank you for it, but Joyful Giving is different. I am asking each member of the congregation to consider increasing their yearly giving by 3% to help with general maintenance and ministry obligations we have.

Soon you will receive a Joyful Giving Package that will include a Narrative Budget and an Intention Card of how you plan to share your gifts of time, talent and treasure. Please complete the Intention Card and return it to the church as soon as possible.

This Easter season please consider what gifts you can offer joyfully to the Ascension, and embrace the opportunity to partner with God! Thank you for your presence, as a gifted and beloved child of God, and for all you do for the work of the Gospel at the Ascension.
